Dear Parishioners,

What is the Holy Eucharist?

Holy Eucharist is the SACRAMENT in which Jesus Christ gives his Body and Blood—himself—for us, so that we too might give ourselves to him in love and be united with him in Holy Communion. Jesus said" I am the living bread that came down from heaven; if anyone eats this bread, they will live forever...Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood, has eternal life. The Holy Eucharist we receive at Mass is the REAL PRESENCE (ACTUAL PRESENCE) OF JESUS CHRIST.

When did Christ institute the Eucharist?

On the night of the Last Supper with his disciples. This night, Jesus anticipates his death, accepts it and transforms it into an action of love for us. He commands his disciples that they much teach others to do the same. "For I received from the Lord what I also delivered to you, that the Lord Jesus on the night when he was betrayed took bread, and when he had given thanks, he broke it, and said, 'This is my body, which is for you. Do this in remembrance of me.' In the same way also the chalice, after supper, saying, 'This chalice is the new covenant in my blood. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me'.

How does the Holy Eucharist impact your life today?

It gives us the grace we need to deny ourselves and to life for Christ, to live for our Life. The more love we have for Christ, the less self-love we have. The more we love God, the more we can resist temptation, and so the Eucharist strengthens us spiritually. The Eucharist transforms our life, the way we think, act, and speak. We become Eucharistic people.

How can I deepen my love for Christ in the Holy Eucharist?

Seek Him in daily Mass as well as on Sunday. If your schedule permits, try to attend daily Mass. It will make an incredible difference.

Visit Him in the tabernacle or in Adoration. Spend time in silent prayer before the Blessed Sacrament.

Pray Eucharistic Prayers. You can do this from home. Start with the Divine Praises in the back of the hymnals found in the pews.

After receiving Jesus in the Eucharist, make an intentional act of communion. Speak from your heart that you want to love Jesus more deeply in your life.

What a gift we have in the Eucharist! The fact that we are strengthened in our ability to love is one of the many graces we receive in this amazing sacrament.
